WHO HE IS: Kievet has more than 32 years of experience in construction and has played a leading role in expanding Boldt's healthcare footprint across the U.S. while also focusing over the last two decades on developing and implementing Integrated Lean Project Delivery® (ILPD). In his role as division president, he's responsible for establishing and expanding Boldt's operations in California, Oklahoma, Michigan, and adjoining markets. Colleagues say his executive abilities and field experience have positioned him to handle all aspects of a construction project and earned him a reputation as
